Irrigation System can only be improved with the participation of farmers: World Bank

World Bank Mission inspected ongoing work under the Sindh Water Sector Improvement Project on 21st & 22nd January 2011 at Choondko & Kunri and got detailed briefing about the progress of the



project from the officials.

The Mission comprised on Mr. Masuod Ahmed, Team Task Leader World Bank, Mr. Ylli Deja, Team Leader of the Project Management and Coordination Agent, Mr. Nazir Mughal, Director Coordination. Mr. Nazeer Essani, General Manager Transition and others are also present.

The mission visited Choondko and different parts of Nara Canal and took briefing about the rehabilitation of the canal.

Later, the members of the mission also visited Khipro canal where they were briefed by the Mr. Mansoor Memon. Divisional Executive Engineer, who said that as government had not released funds for desilting water channels and the growers had collected Rs 5 million and accomplished the task on self-help basis.

Later, members of the mission inspected Kurna minor canal at Umerkot where work had been done under a community-based contract.

The World Bank mission also met with

the office-bearers of farmers' organizations.

Speaking on the occasion, Mr. Masuod



Ahmed lauded the farmers of Khipro canal for desilting the canal on self-help basis. He said irrigation system can only be improved with the participation of farmers.

He said water shortages Pakistan would become acute in future and added that combat this situation the farmers would have to off get rid flood irrigation and adopt modern drip irrigation system to save water.

He said after the rehabilitation of Nara canal under the Water Sector Improvement Project, the water carrying capacity of the canal would increase from 12,000 cusecs to 18.000 cusecs and the tail-end growers would also get water.

SIDA disconnected two illegal connections of SITE

A team of the Sindh Irrigation and Drainage Authority (SIDA) raided RD37 of Akram Wah canal on 8th February 2011 and severed two illegal water connections of the Sindh Industrial Trading Estate (SITE) Hyderabad.

Mr. Aftab Memon. Manager Revenue said that the SITE had installed two illegal water connections to steal water. He said that the approved quantity of water for Site was only one cusec for which a 15 horsepower machine had

been installed. However, the Site had installed two additional machines of 200 horsepower and was drawing six cusec of water.

On this occasion Mr. Nazir Essani, General Manager Transition warned the SITE management that if these two connections were reinstalled, legal action would be taken against them.

Further he said that the SITE had failed to pay an amount of Rs22.4 million outstanding against its approved connection and asked the management to pay the dues otherwise the approved connection would be disconnected.

The Left Bank Canals Area Water Board has decided to issue notices to encroachers on Akram Wah & Phulelli Canal The Left Bank Canals Area Water Board has decided to issue notices to encroachers on Akram Wah, Phulelli Canal, Indus River and channels falling within its jurisdiction to voluntarily vacate illegal occupation.

The process will be carried out systematically first by issuing notices to remove encroachments voluntarily and then legal action will be taken against elements refusing to move out.

Meeting of Review Panel of Experts on "Regional Plan for the Left Bank of Indus River, Delta & Coastal Zone"

Release of water downstream Kotri, plantation of trees along coastal belt, inclusion of previous reports on



national drainage programme, cyclone warning system and insertion of locals` viewpoint while deciding about the drainage were few proposals set forth by experts for warding off natural disasters.

In addition some other points were also discussed by water and environmental experts during a conference held on 3rd March 2011 at SIDA secretariat Hyderabad to discuss the report on water improvement project of the Sindh Irrigation and Drainage Authority on Thursday, under the chairmanship geologist of and chancellor of Isra University Dr Asadullah Kazi.

Experts believed that it was necessary to release water downstream Kotri and plant tress for the protection of coastal belt and deltaic areas from natural disasters, besides setting up a cyclone warning system.
