





INTRODUCTION

The Sindh Water Sector Improvement Project (SWSIP-I) is the World Bank funded project. The overarching objective of SWSIP-I is to improve the efficiency and effectives of the irrigation water distribution in three AWBs (Ghotki, Nara, Left Bank), particularly with respect to measures of reliability, equity and user satisfaction. This would be achieved by:

- (a) deepening and broadening the institutional reforms that are already underway in Sindh,
- (b) improving the irrigation system in systematic way covering key hydraulic infrastructure, main and branch canals, and distributaries and minors, and
- (c) enhancing long-term sustainability of the irrigation system through participatory irrigation management and developing institutions for improving operation and maintenance of the system and cost recovery.

The improved water management would lead to increased agricultural production, employment and income over some about 1.8 million ha or more than 30 percent of the irrigated area in Sindh, and one of the poorest region of the country.

A- Institutional Development of Farmers Organization

1.FO FORMATION:

LBCAWB:

During the month of January-2014, Social team of LBC-AWB focused on (02) FO Formations.

- 1. **Adu Wah:** Mobilization meetings are held with different groups of farmers from head to tail, and a base line survey has been completed. We hope that this formation will be completed in the month of February-2014.
- 2. **Chaneri Distry:** Mobilization meetings were held with farmers and Baseline survey is completed, so it is expected that FO formation will be completed in the end of February-2014.

GFCAWB:

GFCAWB have already completed **3** FO Formations out of **5** minors, below two remaining minors are in under formation process.

- 1. FO formation is in under process on **Imam Wah**, 70 water course associations formed out of 100 water courses.
- 2. FO formation process on **Desert Minor**, is completed, 13 water course associations formed. There is still conflict on BoM that will be resolved by convincing them within a days and Election will be held in the month of February 2014.

Work is underway and it is expected that during January 2014 both FOs will be formed.

NCAWB:

As such the target of FO Formation has been reduced in NCAWB and it was agreed that 10 new FO Formation will be formed. The staff has started mobilization efforts for new FO formation but no any formation held.

2. RE-ELECTION OF FARMERS ORGANIZATIONS:

During the month of January 2014 overall two re-elections of FOs have been done in AWBs, one in NCAWB and one in GFCAWB.

NCAWB:

During the month of Jan 2014 re-election for Board of Management of FO RD-150 L/S minor was held on 31 January 2014 for 3rd tenure under the supervision of returning officer (RO) Muhammed Hashim Bambharo. The general body members of twenty four watercourse associations participated and unanimously selected board of management.

another GB meeting will be called for maximum participation of GB members, leading to free and fair Re-Election process.

GFCAWB:

During the month one Re-Election of FO Sabani Minor was held on 23 January 2014 for third tenure, participation remained 86.66% only single panel came forward, so the selection was done instead of election. Mr. Nazeer Ahmed Memon, General Manager Transition and Mr. Masroor Ahmed Shahwani, Manager SM SIDA attended the re-election as RA representatives.

4. CONFLICT RESOLUTION:

NCAWB:

On FO RD-203 L/S and Santrao minor internal community conflicts are going on distribution of land and installation of illegal pipes and still not resolved. Their cases are going in High court Sukkur.

During the month, the Field Team KGM resolved 01 FO and AWB conflict on the improper guage to Puran Feeder; FO Chairman put up the issue before AEN, EXEN and Director for proper gauge to the FO at head regulator. The Field team KGM assisted and facilitated to resolve this issue after successful meeting with EXEN and Director Nara Canal AWB.

Moreover, the FO KGM minor filed a civil suit against one of the encroacher built a shop at the bank of KGM Minor. In this matter notices were served on the opponent parties and matter is fixed for hearing.

GFCAWB:

During the month of December no any conflict reported in GFCAWB.

LBCAWB:

During the month of January-2014 (02) FO related court cases were attended by social mobilization staff

1. FO Macheri Minor: Still in progress(water issue with irrigation staff of Matli

sub division)

2. FO Khumbharo Minor: Still in progress(water courses issue)

Whereas a petition has also been filled in Honourable High Court Karachi against increase of Abiana rates by (04) Sugar Mills, namely Khoski Sugar Mill, Abadgar Sugar Mill, Bawany Sugar Mill and Army Sugar Mills. Matter is under honorable court trial.

Moreover, during the month of January 2014, the conflict of Ahmed Rajo & Gurho Minor successfully resolved by SM Staff of SDC SIDA.

5-HANDS ON SUPPORT

A- Assist in Abiana Assessment & Collection

NCAWB:

During the reporting month, all the Field Teams of SM mobilized FOs for depositing of Abiana (water charges) to AWB. The Field Teams held 18 special meetings with the FOs for collection of Abiana from the members and deposit in the account of AWB as 60% share. In the result of these meetings, FO Dosso Distry, FO Theba Minor FO Rohro FO Darro Bazar FO Dolatpur Minor, FO Puran Feeder, FO Lolan Distry, FO Chatto, FO Samaro Distry, FO Chachh Minor FO Higorno FO Saifal Minor, and FO New Sunthi Minor collected from the members and deposited in the account of AWB, The remaining FOs are in the process of collection of Abiana from the farmer members and deposit to AWB.

Moreover, SM Staff SDC informed that FO RD-203 L/S has deposited 175000/= (Rupees one lac seventy five) Abiana for the season of Kharif 2013 in the account of Area water board.

Field team Umerkot and Sanghar also assisted the FO Hingorno minor, FO Kunri Distry, FO Bhan Minor, FO Juma Distry, FO Ashabo Minor, FO Doso Distry, FO Sinjhoro, FO Rind, FO Duthro-11 and FO Khori regarding the Abiana Collection. It was discussed with FOs that FOs will try to deposit some amount of Abiana in AWB Account. Due to cotton, onion and rice crop FOs has good opportunity to collect the abiana from farmers.

LBCAWB:

Recovery of Abiana for Kharif-2013-14 is underway. During reporting month Abiana meetings were held with FOs and AWB recovery staff for betterment of abiana recovery process. Commercial contracts renewal is in process as sugar mills have filed petition against increase of abiana rates. Identification of fish farms in all sub divisions of LBC-AWB is under way, proper legalization process will soon be started once they identified.

GFCAWB:

Social team of SIDA/AWB is continuously taking efforts for the assistance, guidance and coordination with FOs within its jurisdiction regarding abiana.

Water Shortage Issues:

Rabi 2014 season is started in LBCAWB, so (02) Canals, (Phulleli and Gunni) are closed as they are Non-Perennial channels, meanwhile Akram Wah is Perennial channel and have enough water for Rabi 2014 season.

6-OTHER ACTIVITIES

6.1- Refresher Training

Refresher training held on FO RD-150 L/S minor on January 31, 2014 at village Rabdino Thebo. The topic of the training was Role and responsibilities of FO and Organizational Management. General Body members and farmers of RD-150 L/S participated in the training. Mr. Waqar Hussain Khokhar Institutional Specialist SIDA delivered the sessions of training. In this training thirty one (31) members participated.

6.2- Desilting

Irrigation system (Main Canal, branch canal, Distributaries and minors) remain close in the month of January. The main purpose of the closure period is to repair and maintain of channels. During flowing of water, silt deposition and scouring occurs in beds and banks of the channels. Silt deposition and scouring reduces the conveyance efficiency of the system. So channel operation and maintenance (O&M) is essential seasonally or yearly. Field team SIDA Choondko facilitated and coordinated with FOs for de-siltation.

In the month of January 2014 eight FOs got efforts and de-silted their channels through self help basis. The detail are given in below table.

6.3- Visit of M&E Official at FO Hingorno and FO Khori:

The M&E Official Mr.Rana Abdul Rehman (Principal Sociologist) Agriculture Division Lahore visited FO Hingorno and FO Khori on16th of January 2014. In this visit IS-SIDA Umerkot also participated to coordinate them with FOs. The main purpose of this visit was to know the

working of FOs and to identify the problems which have been faced by FOs. In this regard the problems faced by FOs regarding Abiana Collection were discussed in detail. It was also discussed that the representatives of FOs should give some suggestions and innovations for the further strengthening of FOs.

6.4- Visit of M&E, PIC & SIDA Field Staff at FO Doso & Juma Distry

Assistant Engineer (FOs) Field Team Umerkot Visited Doso Distry, Juma Distry head to tail along with RE PIC & M&E Team regarding observations pointed out by M& E during the meeting held @ NCAWB, also attended the BOM meeting arranged by Newly elected Body of FO Doso Distry @ FO office in Phuladyun City. Newly elected Body of Farmers insisted for construction of remaining outlets of Doso Distry. It was decided by team members that Deck slab of FOOT Bridge constructed @ RD-20 Doso Distry should be rectified by contractor. Then we visited FO Juma Distry, Started the visit from Head regulator of Juma Distry & then went to Sigh minor. Farmers of FO Juma also arranged a BOM meeting, Assistant Engineer (FO), M&E Team & RE PIC also participated in the meeting & discussed the Rehabilitation works.

6.5- One Day Session on FOs Maturity Survey under Component A3 Sindh Water Sector Improvement Project (WSIP)

Under Component A3 of WSIP, Capacity Building of Farmers Organization a general survey regarding institutional maturity is going to be conducted through Social Staff of SIDA/AWB in collaboration with M&E Consultants WSIP. The overall objective of the survey is to see the maturity level of farmer's organization and after detail screening of FOs they may further be facilitated in term of providing them FO Offices and Equipment. The M&E Consultants would be over all incharge of the survey.

Session:

All social staff of SIDA and AWBs gathered on 27th January 2014 at Committee Room, SIDA Secretariat Hyderabad to attend a session regarding procedure and guidelines for FO survey. The whole session was facilitated by General Manager Transition and gave his valuable remarks. Mr. Masroor Ahmed Shahwani, Act. Rehabilitation Works Status

The overall Physical and Financial progress of component B2 is 97.27% and 71% respectively. The overall physical progress of component B2 in the reporting period is very minute about 0.13%, because most of the contracts are almost completed. The final cost of many contracts is expected to decrease, which will increase the overall Financial Progress at end. The Financial Progress of component B2 in the reporting period is 1%, which is due to decrease in final cost of three contracts.

C- PROJECT IMPACT

The overall project objects are improving efficiency of infrastructure of irrigation system and strengthening institutions which are working under reforms and reduced water shortage at level of various channels and make efficient.

For the promotion of success of institutional reforms major stakeholders are working collectively. One of the major stakeholder being a water user, FOs are actively participating in rehabilitation works such as conducting consultative meetings, attending orientation workshops, participating in walk through surveys to acquire the initial data of the channels, the encroachments. Identification of several community infrastructures like FO offices, Buffalo wallows, Washing Ghats, Foot Bridges, Village road Bridges etc. and also keep check on the quality and quantities of ongoing rehabilitation works through participatory irrigation management as signing and verify the Interim Payment Certificate along with AWB officials, Consultants and SIDA officials.

Due to such participatory approach a sense of ownership has been developed and due to rehabilitation works water carrying capacity in the channels have been improved which also effects on increase of per capita income of the farmers family.

D-ISSUES

1- Field Issues:

The vehicles and bikes available in field were procured under SOFWM Project during 2005 and the condition is so worst. New vehicles should be provided in field.

Field team Choondko is facing difficulties due to unavailability of technical record of FOs. During handing over the channels only IDMT Agreement was given to FOs chairmen, Many letters were written Executive Engineer and Assistant Executive Engineer for technical record but no any response received.

Field team Choondko also face critical situations during re-elections of FOs for 3rd tenure. Many influential FOs chairmen don't want to leave their position and want to remain FO chairman for third tenure, While there is no provision in Sindh Water Management Ordinance -2002 (SWMO-2002) for consequent third tenure. But instead of this Field Team is striving hard to legalize the FOs through mobilization efforts.

2- Office Issues:

No any Office Boy and Office Assistant available in field offices. There are also old computers and printers and no internet facility. Rent agreements of Field Office SIDA Choondko, Ghotki and Badin have been expired on Dec 31st,2013. The same agreements has been revised.

E-CONCLUSION

During the month of January 2014 Social field teams of SIDA and AWBs were fully mobilized to gear up an extensive program. After all it's all about the change and no one can impose the change at the level of any society/community. If the change becomes challenge for the system/community so it will require serious response. The field teams are striving hard to achieve their project targets under the supervision of SIDA/AWBs.
